Hunstanton Golf Club - 20th and 21st May 2025

Report and Results

Report

The Spring Meeting of the Society was held at Hunstanton on Tuesday 20th and Wednesday 21st May 2025. This was the 70th consecutive visit to Hunstanton, going back to 1956. Before that, the EGS was at Hunstanton in 1933, 1935, and 1947 – 1954, so this was our 80th visit to Hunstanton.

The very dry spell of weather continued throughout the meeting although it was a bit overcast on Wednesday. However, there was a more than brisk northerly wind which blew throughout and shifted slightly on Wednesday. This was the opposite to the prevailing wind and therefore made some of the front nine holes very challenging and was also strong enough to make it difficult to judge the downwind shots. Overall captain Jon Clackett came away with a clean sheet with respect to any rain again.

This year, 29 members were joined by 4 guests on Tuesday and Wednesday and we were privileged that

Simon Flint the Hunstanton club captain joined us on Tuesday, giving a total of 34 players on Tuesday and 33 on Wednesday. The good turn out was the same as last year.

The course, like many others, had had very little rain and we could have been playing it at the end of the summer given the parched fairways and light rough. The greens were true albeit slightly slower because the greenkeepers had not cut them tight due to the dry weather. However, overall, the course was presented very well and it was a pleasure to play as always. The club did not provide us with the buggies that they promised and this meant that some members did not finish their round on Tuesday which was a great shame.

There were some good scores in both Divisions but this was balanced out by some not so good scores but the average was slightly higher than last year.



In Division 1, Chris Uren shot an excellent round of 79 to win the Hopewell Challenge Cup for the best gross score; Stephen Dermody scored 83 to come second, with Andy Salmon third on 87. Chris Uren also won the President's Challenge Cup for the best stableford score in Division 1 with an excellent score of 41 points; Stephen Dermody was in second place with 36 points; Peter Stevenson was in third with 32 points.

In Division 2, Howard Richings won the Roy Withers Trophy for the best gross score with a round of 88; Dino Nicola was second with 95 and Helen Stone was third with a score of 99. Howard Riching's score was also good enough to win the Wilson Challenge Cup for the best stableford score in this division with 35 points. Gavin Lakey was second with 33 points, and Dino Nicola was third with 31 points.

Chris Uren and Howard Richings also won the captain's Prizes of a voucher from the pros shop for winning the stableford competitions in their respective divisions.

Chris's score at Hunstanton of 41, combined with his score of 28 at Woking last year, won him the Myddleton Memorial Trophy (for

the best aggregate score from Hunstanton this year plus the previous year's score at Woking) with a combined total of 69, with Howard Richings second with 65 points and Stephen Dermody third with 64 points.



Peter Stevenson won the Midgley Trophy (which is kept on display in the Hunstanton bar) for the best stableford score plus half age with a score of 74.24. Howard Richings was second with 73.13 and Ian Herrington in third with 71.66.

Matthew Herring won the Guest competition with a score of 31 points on countback with John Uren in second also with 31.

The food throughout was excellent as ever, and we were very well looked after by the catering staff and we once again rewarded them with a gratuity.

We were delighted to be joined for the evening meal by Simon Flint the Hunstanton captain. Simon congratulated the Society on their 70th consecutive visit and updated us with some of the plans for improving the course over the

next 5 years. This includes reducing the height of the 6th and 17th greens as they were starting to settle and

reconfiguring some holes in the centre of the course and in particular the blind 14th. All this work has yet to be agreed by the members. The EGS captain, as per tradition, provided the members with port which was (mostly) passed clockwise around the table in the decanter which is kept at Hunstanton.

The auction almost seemed to be well organised by someone who had read (and understood) the rules. Our thanks to auctioneer, Ian Purser, and in particular Howard and Jane Richings for making it run very smoothly. The ball sweep ran smoothly thanks to vice captain, Helen Stone and the Honorary Secretary was particularly pleased with the outcome.

On Friday, the competition for the Hunter Twiss Cups was well contested as usual, with a close finish and good scores at the top, but slightly lower than last year given the difficulty of the wind. Ian Purser retained the trophy, this time with a new partner, John Foulsham with 67 points, with John Stewart and Richard



Scott second with 64 points on countback and Stephen Dermody and Chris Davies third also on 64 points.



The dates for 2026 have been provisionally booked as 12th and 13th May but this has yet to be confirmed by the club. The good news is that over the past year, we have confirmed our attendance for a Tuesday and Wednesday and agreed a 3 year price deal with the club. This is a big step forward given where we were this time last year and our thanks go to Norman Schunter who has been instrumental in these negotiations. Therefore we are delighted that we can continue our visits to Hunstanton and maintain all the traditions that have built up over the years.
