Report

We had another successful day for the Society's Summer meeting at North Hants on Wednesday 10th June. We were again fortunate to have more good weather for the meeting despite some showers forecast at some point during the day that never arrived. There was a stiffish breeze throughout the day which made the course even more challenging. The conditions were very similar to last year.

This was the 12th time that the Society has played at North Hants and we are always well looked after when we visit. This year was no exception; lunch was good although the bacon rolls were not so good as last year according to Mr Purser!

Overall the course was in great condition with very true greens with subtle borrows which made putting a bit of a challenge. Recent rain meant the course was looking very green and the fairways were in good condition again and the rough had not had a chance to grow due to the early dry weather. Having not played last year the Honorary Secretary made sure he tried out most of the bunkers over the day and can confirm that they were much improved after the recent work on the course. Many bunkers had new "eye-brows" which made getting out of them more difficult.

The turnout was the same as last year but still down from 2021, with 20 members and 1 guest (total 21). The Society welcomed Henry Bowden who had contacted us via linked in.

As was the case in previous years, the scoring was not high for most players, as the course is a real test of golf. Only 6 players of the 21 scored over 30 points in the morning. The average scores of 27 for Division 1 and 26 for Division 2 were even lower than last year.



However, in the morning, there were two stand out scores competing for the Denis Lacy-Hulbert Trophy for the best overall stableford score on the day. The winner, from Division 1, was Paul McQuade with an excellent score of 38 points winning on count back from Chris Uren also on 38 points; David Street was third with 30 points.

Leslie Tonks in Division 2 won the Mike Drain Trophy for the best stableford score in the other Division from the overall winner with 31 points on countback; 2nd place in Division 2 was taken by Martyn Taylor also with 31 points; John Wild was 3rd on 30 points.

The Nearest the Pin competition on the 8th was won by Neil Farmer.

In the afternoon, Chris Uren and David Street won the Timmis Cups with 36 points. This was Chris' second win in a row in the North Hants foursomes, this year with a different partner. Rhys Bright and Marc Griffin took second place with 31 points from Mike Lazer and Paul McQuade in



3rd place also with 29 points. Some of the Members enjoyed tea and sandwiches at the end of the day and a the day was capped off by a visit to the Rose Room for those who have not experienced it.
